In exploring the transforming role of tourism in community development, this book places a strong emphasis on the necessity of giving local communities the authority they need to shape a sustainable future.

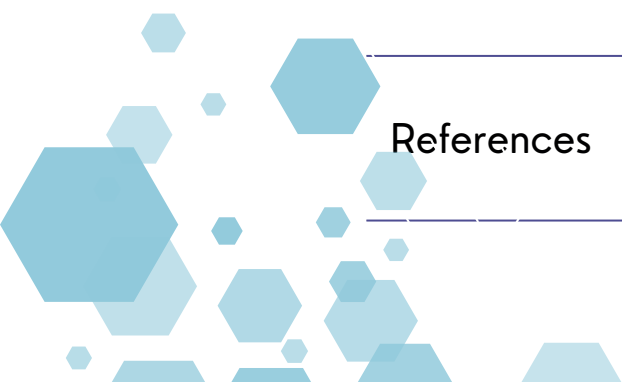

What is CBT?

- • CBT is a type of sustainable tourism that requires the participation and involvement of local communities at the tourism destination.
- • CBT is a sort of rural tourism that is regulated by communities and is meant to benefit the entire community.
- • In Malaysia, most of CBT programmes are centred on homestay programming and are implemented in rural areas.
- • CBT involves local communities from planning, development, and administration of tourist activities, with the objective of producing economic and social benefits for the community and at the same time protecting its cultural and natural resources.
- • Local inhabitants in CBT welcome visitors to visit or stay in their towns by providing overnight lodging, engaging in community-organized cultural and recreational events, and interacting with local locals to learn about their way of life.



Concept of CBT

CBT is based on the distinctive items available in the area, and the local community must support the overall growth of tourism.

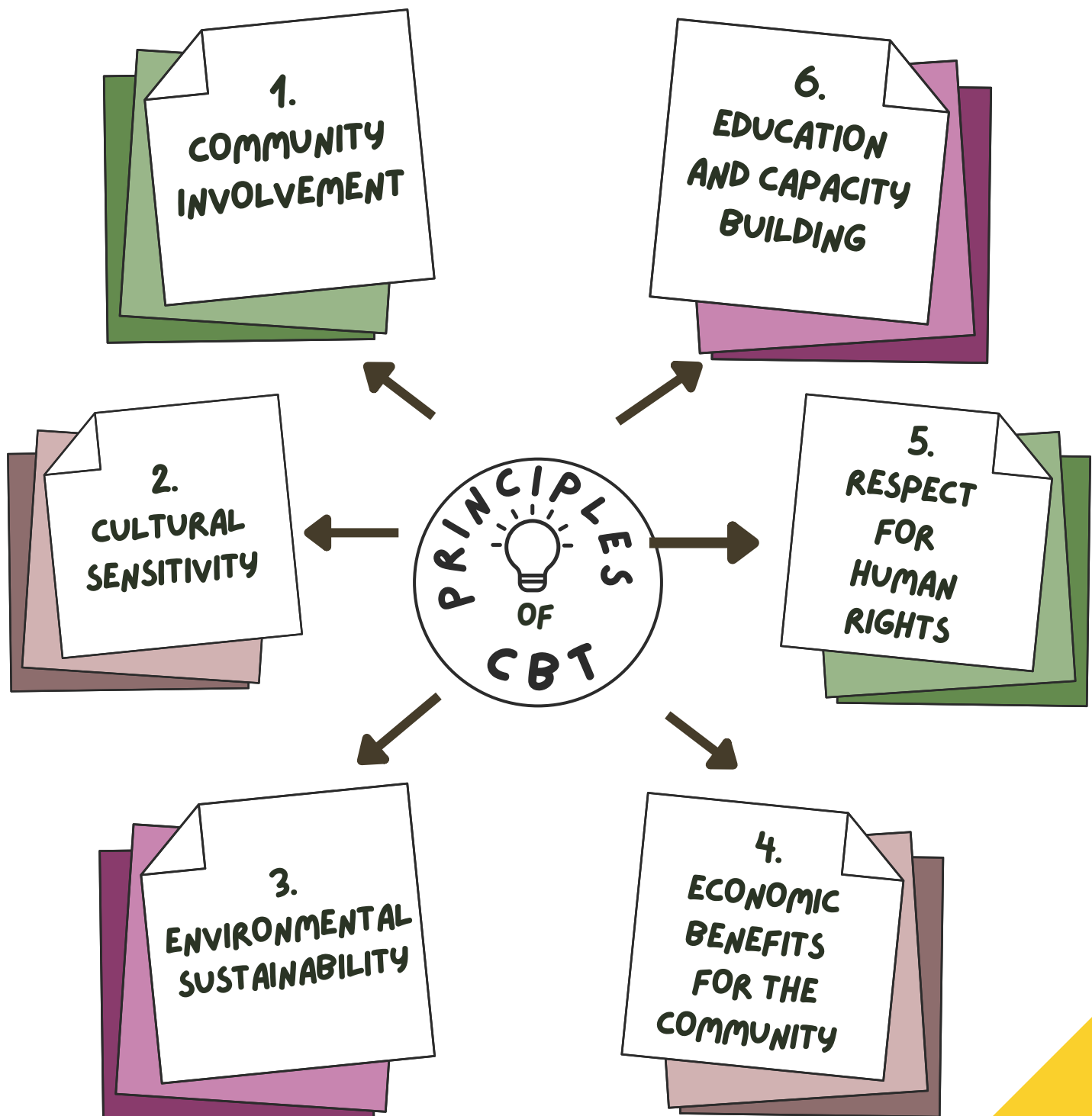
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PRINCIPLES OF CBT?

CULTURAL DEVELOPMENT:

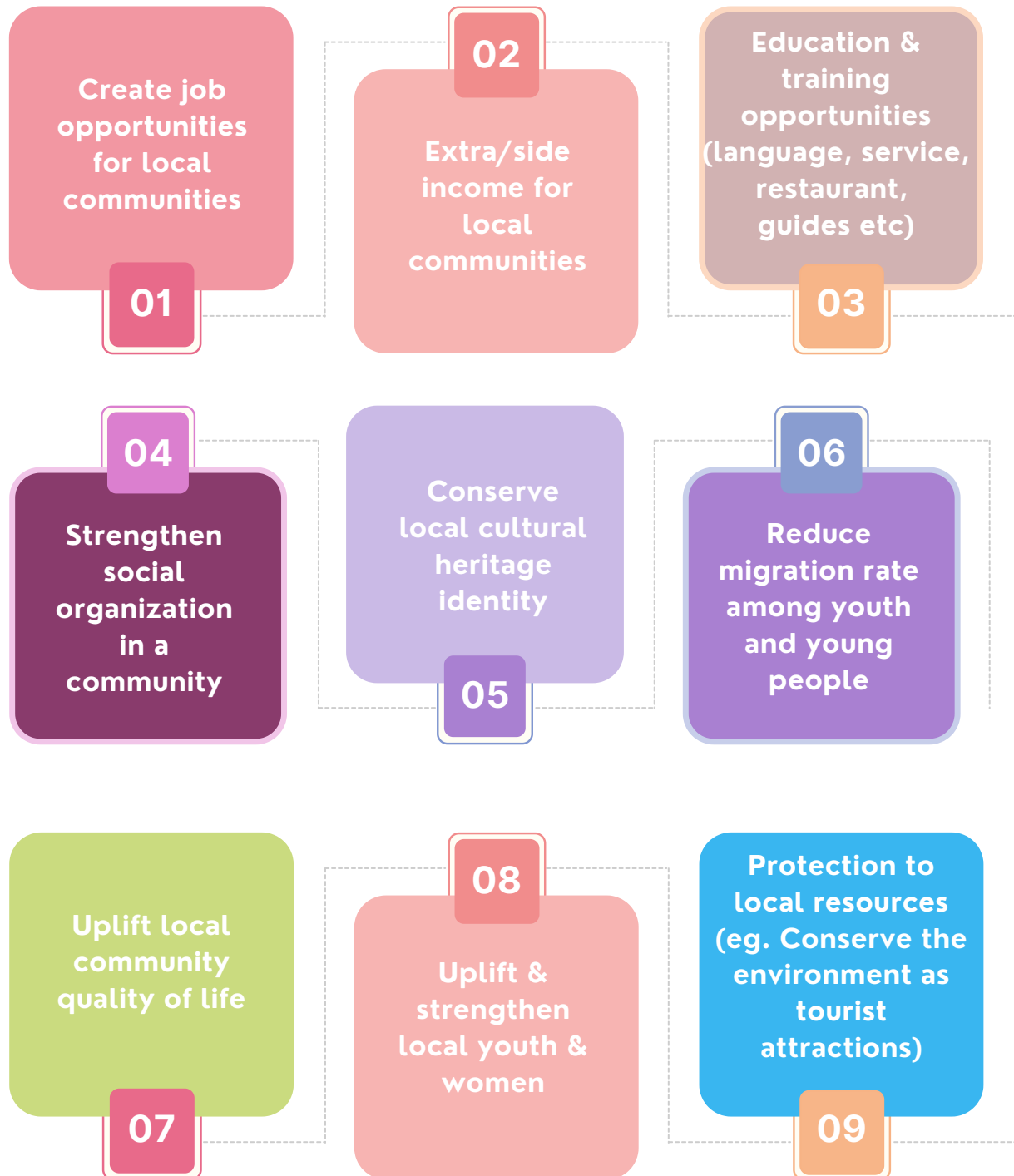

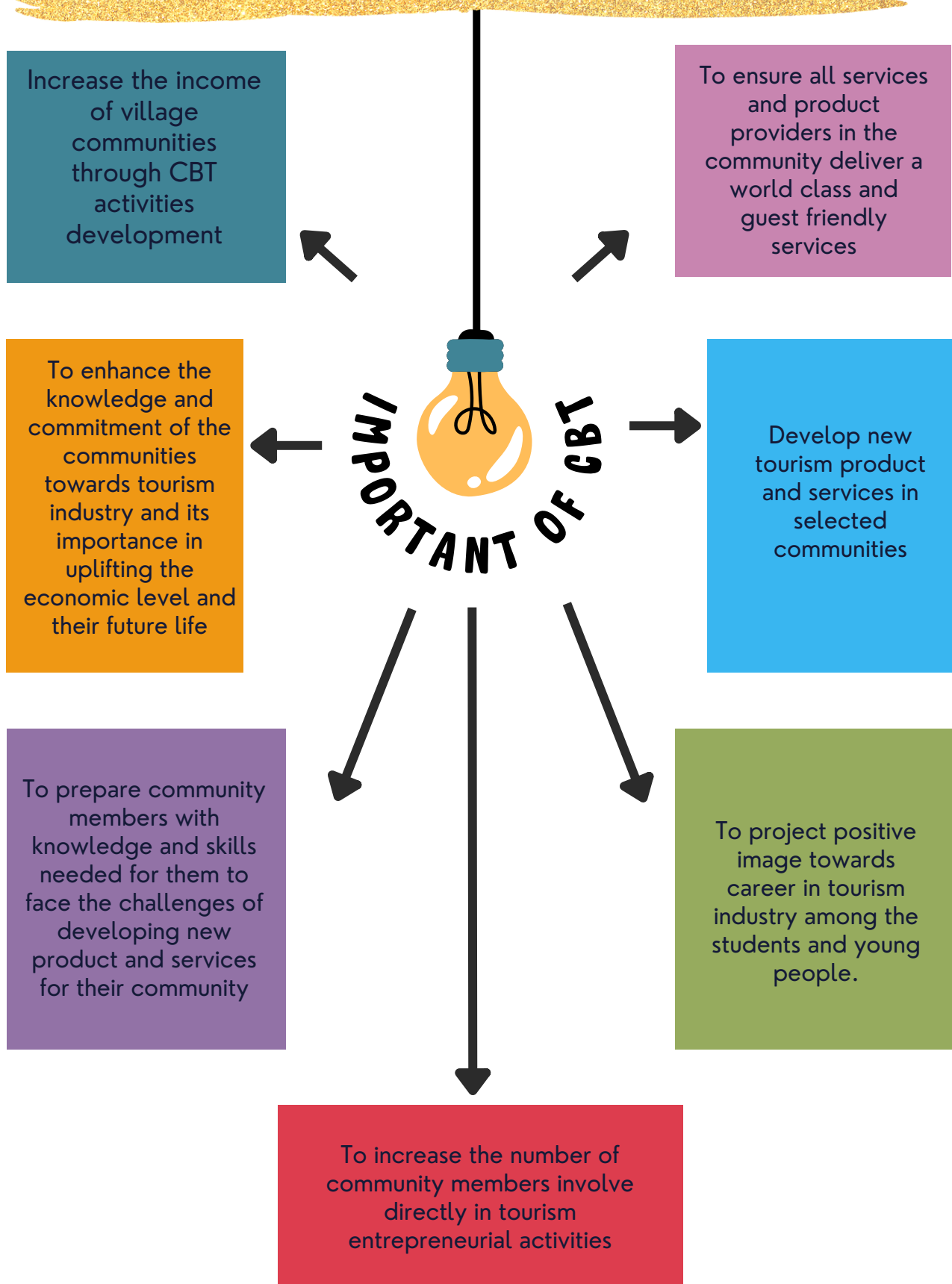

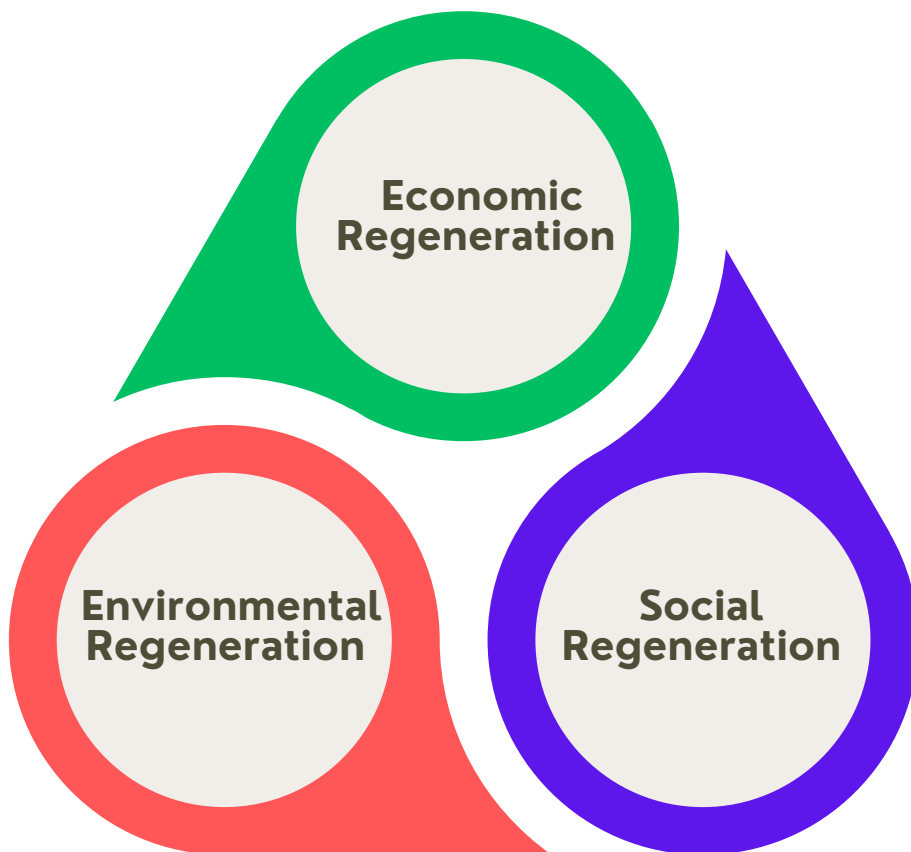

Tourism may be used to promote regeneration in the following ways:



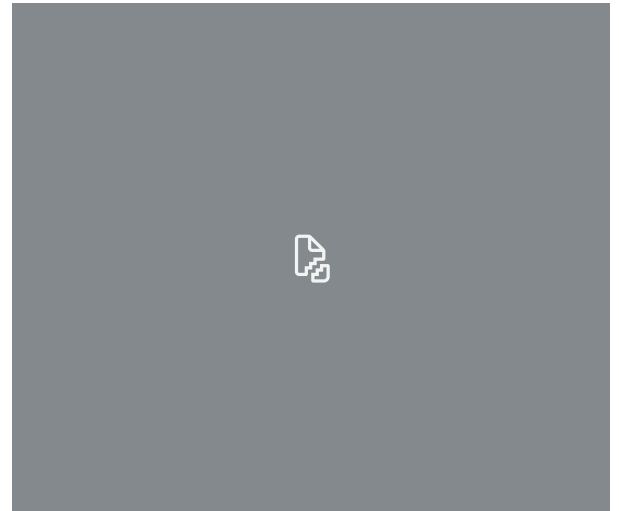


ECONOMIC REGENERATION
